Roy W. Blizzard, Jr., Ph.D. – In addition to a Bachelors degree, he has two Masters, one in archaeology/anthropology and religion, one in the general field of Hebrew Studies and a Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin in the general field of Hebrew Studies. Much of his academic career has been spent in the classroom or in the field in Israel, Jordan, Egypt, Turkey, Greece, Italy and the Mediterranean isles either participating in archeological excavations or directing historical and archeological study seminars. He has written a number of books, hundreds of articles, wrote, directed and hosted over 500 TV programs on Israel and the Middle East and continues to serve as a technical advisor in addition to teaching and lecturing around the country. He is the head of Biblical Research Foundation and works with a number of scholars in the scientific, religious and secular fields.

Ronald W. Moseley, Ph.D. - a brief summary of his academic credentials include studies at Princeton Theological Seminary, University of Texas, Oxford Graduate School, and Oxford University, where he read and studied five years. His background includes twelve years of summer study at the Hebrew University and Jerusalem University in Israel. He has a Master in Divinity, a Master in Jewish Studies, a Ph.D. in Second Temple History, a D.Phil. In Religion and Society, and D.Litt. In Research. In 2003, he was awarded the Chancellor's Award for Research at Oxford Graduate School. Between the years of 2004 and 2006, he was awarded the Status of Fellow and Scholar in the Oxford Society of Scholars. As the author of thirteen books, he has spent his life investigating the biblical text.

Paul L. Maier, Ph.D. - The Russell H. Seibert Professor of Ancient Near East History with a Ph.D. from the University of Basel, where he graduated summa cum laude. He has a Master of Arts from Harvard and a Master of Divinity from Concordia Seminary. Dr. Maier regularly appears on television documentaries and writes for numerous journals including Harvard Theological Review, Concordia Theology Quarterly, and Christianity Today. Dr. Maier has authored several popular books including *The Essential Works of Josephus* and he presently teaches at Western Michigan University.

Johnnie E. Bradford, Ph.D. - He has a Master in Arts in Hebrew Studies and a Ph.D. in Hebrew Studies from the University of Texas at Austin.
